TIME, PLACE AND ATTENDANCE	The Moriarty City Council met at a Regular Council Meeting on May 14, 2025, with the following members present: Brandon Webb, Steve Anaya, and Jeremy Trujillo (on the telephone from 7:55pm until 8:34pm) then continued his attendance in-person. Kim Garcia was absent.
CALL TO ORDER	Mayor Brandon Webb called the meeting to order at 7:33 pm
ADD TO AGENDA FOR DISCUSSION ONLY	Steve Anaya addressed the serious state of streets' potholes and requested Public Works Director, Jeff Tapia, to bring an update back to Council at the regular Council meeting scheduled for May 28 ^{th,} 2025.
	Steve Anaya requested Mayor Webb to add the landscaping projects amended quotes and final design proposal presentations for Grissom Park, Mt. Carmel and Mountain View Cemeteries to the City Council Agenda scheduled for May 28th, 2025.
	Steve Anaya addressed the City's receipt of an OSHA letter on May 8, 2025, requiring improvements to City Hall which include: the ventilation system, addition of hot water, plumbing, fixing tile floors, etc. He requested Mayor Webb to create a plan where possibly monthly building maintenance walk-throughs are done. Mayor Webb mentioned the possible creation of a maintenance crew that would be tasked to keep facilities in working condition.

Debbie Ortiz presented the challenges the local community is experiencing with marijuana, drugs and alcohol consumption and the measures being taken to assist such individuals. No Action Taken.
PUBLIC WORKS DIRECTOR JEFF TAPIA BOHANNAN HOUSTON DONZIL WORTHINGTON	UPDATE BY BOHANNAN HOUSTON REGARDING THE WASTEWATER PLANT AND TASK ORDER FOR THE PRELIMINARY ENGINEERING REPORT (PER).
	Presented the Agreement to enter a PER with a grant of \$75,000. Recommended the City to enter into a month-to-month or as needed contract with Rocky Mountain Water in Edgewood, NM, to assist with the sludge removal. Informed that NM received \$360M in funds for water clean-up and conservation, thus the availability of grants that could cover 90% of the cost of design and grants that pay 100% of a designated project through the Water Trust Fund.
	The council requested the need for a sludge removal plan by the end of May 2025.
